Further details of the contents of the Semester One 2019 papers follows:

SOSC 021R- Soils and Soil Management

An introduction to the nature and properties of soils. Often the soil is forgotten when considering plant husbandry but an understanding of the biological, chemical and physical nature of the soils you are working with will enable you to be a better horticulturalist.

COMP 021R – Computing and Communications

This paper has been revised to reflect the growing use of computing in horticulture and the increased skill levels required just to be in the business. The focus is on laboratory work in front of a computer with a mix of communications theory and practice.

Free fees

If this is the first time you are doing tertiary study, you could be eligible for fees-free study. Wendy can email further details to you if you think you are eligible or check it out at https://www.feesfree.govt.nz/

Credit for National Certificate in Horticulture (NCH) (L4) Units (recognition for prior learning)

Lincoln University and the Primary ITO have an agreement that allows for the transfer of credits gained as unit standards for some Lincoln University Diploma papers and vice versa. If you have been training at a Polytech or in the industry for the NCH (L4), or you have completed a qualification at a NZ University send a copy of your Record of Learning to Lincoln University and you may get a pleasant surprise. Contact Lana Williams, email lana.williams@lincoln.ac.nz or phone 03 423 0098. Please note Lincoln's website states that a fee of \$75 including GST will be charged for each cross credit sought. The earlier you start the process the better, we suggest you do this now if it is applicable to you as it may mean one less paper is required for you to complete the Diploma.

Scholarships

Fees, loans and allowances

Course fees for the papers on offer for 2019 are not confirmed, in 2018 costs were \$860 per paper including GST plus an additional annual student services levy of \$60 (incl GST). The course fee is payable at the time of enrolment to confirm your place on the course. Evaluation feedback

At the completion of each semester we seek feedback in the form of evaluations of the tutors and the courses. We value this feedback and where we can we take it on board and do our utmost to improve what we need to and continue to deliver what we are doing well. In relation to our latest semester papers (Management and Engineering) the things we can work on and help to improve are:

Management:

- 75% of students rated the course as being very good.
- A request for fewer field trips (a course requirement so more difficult to alter).
- More exam questions prior to the exam (previous exam questions are provided on the Lincoln Learn site for each paper). The tutor will endeavour to refer you to relevant exam questions for the material learnt each week.
- More resources the tutor will keep this in mind when preparing weekly material and add relevant resources. The tutor to ask the class regularly if there is more information required then it can be sourced and supplied.

Engineering:

- 80% of students rated the course as being very good.
- Students would like slides prepared based on what comes up in the exams. The tutor will work on getting lab-based material for future courses.
- Resource book content to be improved Fruition will continue to provide additional resources and information where we feel it is needed. We continually seek improvements from Lincoln with regards to updated resources.

Practical Work

To complete your Diploma in Horticulture you need to complete a practical work report. If you wish to graduate in April 2019 you need to have your practical work report into Lincoln by 1 February 2019.
