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Further details of the contents of the Semester One 2021 papers follows:

COMP 021R Computing and Communications

This paper has been revised to reflect the growing use of computing in horticulture and the increased skill levels required just to be in the business. The focus is on laboratory work in front of a computer with a mix of communications theory and practice.

SOSC 021R Soils and Soil Management

An introduction to the nature and properties of soils. Often the soil is forgotten when considering plant husbandry but an understanding of the biological, chemical, and physical nature of the soils you are working with will enable you to be a better horticulturalist.

Free fees

Lincoln University currently offer free fees to domestic students for three of its sub-degree programmes which includes the **Diploma in Horticulture** from **July 2020 until December 2022**. This is due to the Governments Targeted Training and Apprenticeship Fund. An even better time to study the Diploma in Horticulture as you won't pay anything if you complete the study in the two years (which is possible when studying 2 papers per semester).

Fees, loans, and allowances

Currently there are no course fees for the Diploma in Horticulture study.

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Scholarships

Whilst fees are free to assist you with other study related expenses there are many Lincoln University Scholarships available the following link provides details of scholarships specifically available for those studying the Diploma in Horticulture

Credit for National Certificate in Horticulture (NCH) (L4) Units (recognition for prior learning)

Lincoln University and the Primary ITO have an agreement that allows for the transfer of credits gained as unit standards for some Lincoln University Diploma papers and vice versa. If you have been training at a Polytech or in the industry for the NCH (L4), or you have completed a qualification at a NZ University send a copy of your Record of Learning to Lincoln University and you may get a pleasant surprise. Evaluation feedback

At the completion of each semester we seek feedback in the form of evaluations of the tutors and the courses. We value this feedback and thank those who complete it. The responses are completely anonymous. In relation to our latest semester papers (Horticultural Management Systems B and Engineering) the tutor feedback has been summarised below:

Horticultural Management Systems B:

The students found the tutor to have empathy, is friendly and resource emails were helpful as were field trips. The students liked the use of real-life examples and the consistency provided in the weekly recaps. The obstacles to learning were online learning for some – as tutors we will do our best to guide you in the use of the Lincoln "Learn" site and be more aware that this and online learning in general may be an issue for some. As tutors we will work to ensure we use technology well and include more online tools like Kahoot guizzes etc to mix up the learning and where possible include any practical learning to our delivery.

Engineering:

The students liked how the tutor found ways to make the learning interesting and simplified in-depth explanations backed up with real life examples. The tutor encouraged questions and provided individual help and were available for questions. Obstacles to learning were the fact a lot of the learning was online; the course material wasn't relevant to horticulture and a lot of abbreviated and American terms were used.

As tutors we need to be aware of such terminology especially when we have students for who English is their second language and where possible introduce practical learning into the weekly sessions.

Practical Work

To complete your Diploma in Horticulture you need to complete a practical work report. You do not need to consider completing this report until you are near completion of all eight Diploma papers.
