Further details of the contents of the Semester Two 2021 papers follows:

BIOS 022R - Plant Health

This course will cover:

- An introduction to the biology and management of pest and pathogenic organisms of horticultural crops.
- An introduction to agrichemicals, their safe and efficient use.
- Common pests and diseases in horticultural crops, their development, spread and control.

Wendy Bradley will tutor this paper.

PLSC 021R – Plant Studies

This is a paper that really gets to the nub of plant production. If you want to understand more about how to achieve better dry matter in kiwifruit or manage biennial bearing in avocados you absolutely must understand how plants function.

This course will cover:

- An introduction to the process of plant identification.
- Plant morphology, classification, nomenclature, and plant keys.
- Plant structure, plant growth and plant functions.
- Factors influencing plant growth.
- Plant life cycles and the plant kingdom.
- Plant ecology including concepts of energy flows and ecosystem dynamics.

Ruth Underwood will tutor this paper.

Free fees

Lincoln University currently offer free fees to domestic students for three of its sub-degree programmes which includes the **Diploma in Horticulture** from **July 2020 until December 2022**. This is due to the Governments Targeted Training and Apprenticeship Fund. An even better time to study the Diploma in Horticulture as you will not pay anything if you complete the study in the two years (which is possible when studying 2 papers per semester).

Fees, loans, and allowances

Currently there are no course fees for the Diploma in Horticulture study.

Scholarships

Credit for National Certificate in Horticulture (NCH) (L4) Units (recognition for prior learning)

Lincoln University and the Primary ITO have an agreement that allows for the transfer of credits gained as unit standards for some Lincoln University Diploma papers and vice versa. If you have been training at a Polytech or in the industry for the NCH (L4), or you have completed a qualification at a NZ University send a copy of your Record of Learning to Lincoln University and you may get a pleasant surprise. Evaluation feedback

At the completion of each semester we seek feedback in the form of evaluations of the tutors and the courses. We value this feedback and thank those who complete it. The responses are completely anonymous. In relation to our latest semester papers (Computing & Communication, and Soils & Soil Management) the feedback has been summarised:

Some students would prefer classes to be in Tauranga but given current numbers it is way more comfortable to be able to do these at our Te Puke classroom even if for some it means more travel (including for the tutors). We are sure this is better than working in a confined space, especially with Covid.

<u>Computing & Communications (Tutor - Phoebe Scherer):</u>

Overall students rated the tutor and course well - points we were asked to improve on from our mid semester survey were to clarify differences between labs and assignments and provide examples of what is expected for assignments. Some learners found the speed of the Kahoot quiz challenging – just remember they are only one tool used to help students review.

From the final evaluation – it was good to know students found LEARN (Lincoln's <u>Moodle</u> site) helpful and nice to know the tutors were appreciated.

<u>Soils & Soil Management (Tutor – Ruth Underwood):</u>

Students in general rated the course and tutor well. Points we will take on board include the addition of a field trip to see soils in depth and face to face, have regular review tests and visit potential exam questions early on. It was requested we share results of tests, etc – this is a university policy and out of our control. Where it is possible to provide feedback, we will.

Practical Work

To complete your Diploma in Horticulture you need to complete a practical work report. You do not need to consider completing this report until you are near completion of all eight Diploma papers.
