# **MGMT 027R Horticultural Management Systems B**

An introduction to the principles of financial management in horticulture, including investment analysis, land purchase, debt servicing and accounting. Includes the study of horticultural production and management systems and a series of field case studies of selected horticultural enterprise systems. Much of the teaching is focused around three field trips looking at various horticultural enterprises. When we have a field trip, we will undertake to do this on the afternoon of the class day (i.e. on a Tuesday) and we will not hold a class that evening.

#### Free fees

Lincoln University currently offer free fees to domestic students for three of its sub-degree programmes which includes the **Diploma in Horticulture** from **July 2020 until December 2022**. This is due to the Governments Targeted Training and Apprenticeship Fund. This fund does end this year in December.

#### Ahuwhenua Karahipi

Value: \$5,000 Region: All

Study Level: First Time Student

Study Area: Agriculture

Open to school leaver students of Māori descent enrolled in an undergraduate or sub-degree study in the Agricultural, mahinga kai or organics field at Lincoln University.

The karahipi value is of \$5,000 paid out fortnightly during the academic year. The successful applicant/s will be required to contribute positively to Māori events on campus and/or the activities of Te Awhioraki, the Lincoln University Māori Students' Association.

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#### **Putaiao Karahipi**

Value: \$5,000 Region: All

**Study Level:** First Time Student

Study Area: Agriculture, Science & Mathematics

Open to students of Māori descent who are entering undergraduate study at Lincoln University in a Science

related field.

The value of the karahipi will be \$5,000 paid out in fortnightly instalments during the academic year. Applicants must have evidence of excellence in science related secondary school subjects and have demonstrated leadership potential in the Māori community.

# Credit for National Certificate in Horticulture (NCH) (L4) Units (recognition for prior learning)

Lincoln University and the Primary ITO have an agreement that allows for the transfer of credits gained as unit standards for some Lincoln University Diploma pepa and vice versa. If you have been training at a Polytech or in the industry for the NCH (L4), or you have completed a qualification at a NZ University send a copy of your Record of Learning to Lincoln University, email <a href="mailto:lana.williams@lincoln.ac.nz">lana.williams@lincoln.ac.nz</a> or phone 03 423 0098. We suggest you do this now if it is applicable to you as it may mean one less paper to study to complete the Diploma.

# **Evaluation feedback/urupare**

At the completion of each semester we seek urupare in the form of evaluations of the tutors and the courses. We value this urupare and thank those who complete it. The responses are completely anonymous. In relation to our latest semester pepa (Hort Mgmt A and Propagation) the urupare has been summarised:

#### <u>Hort Management (Tutor – Sophie Twigley):</u>

58% of students responded, so just over half the class. The lowest rating out of 5 was an average of 3.57 regarding course materials & handouts (how useful/well produced), all tutor related questions received 4.43 and higher ratings.

What to improve – be back in class, for everyone to feel their contributions are valuable and feel comfortable to contribute, have a logical topic flow, deeper knowledge/information with examples provided.

What worked well – being online helped with time management, and practical assessment tasks.

#### Propagation & Nursery (Tutor – Ruth Underwood):

40% of students responded, the lowest ratings were for course length and tutor enthusiasm (3.75 average out of 5). Other ratings averaged 4.33 and above.

What to improve – opportunity for student interaction and group activities.

What worked well – handouts, online, and fantastic tutor with amazing depth of knowledge.

#### **Practical Work**

To complete your Diploma in Horticulture you need to complete a practical work report. You do not need to consider completing this report until you are near completion of all eight Diploma papers.
